

The Committee works on organizing the eyeglass collections and processing and needs hands on Volunteers. Lions District 33S has been recycling eyeglasses for the last Seven years. The first three years, the efforts were directed at fulfilling a commitment to the people of Sri Lanka with over 33,000 pairs of eyeglasses being sent. At the same time, over 20,000 pairs of eyeglasses were provided to support a Rotary International mission to Chilayo, Peru. One Lion's year the District had a commitment to provide 12,000 pairs of eyeglasses to the Greater Monrovia Lions Club in Liberia along with 15 cases of Braille books to a school for the blind.
