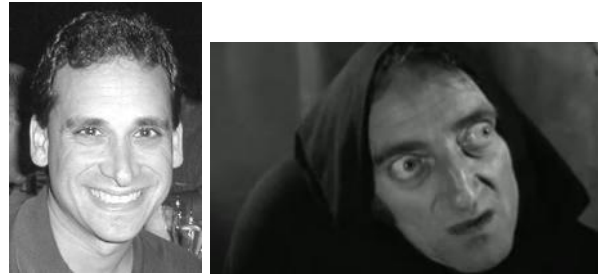
Recycle for Sight Report
