Lee Williams visits Bonita Springs Lions

On a recent trip to my winter place in Cape Coral, I went on a trip to Bonita Springs just south of Cape Coral and north of Naples. The trip was a volunteer day for the ECHO organization for which Betty W puts in lots of time. ECHO was a speaker at the Easton Lions Club a ways back and our club gave them nice financial support.

The Bonita Springs Lions Club is one of the very best in the country and the ones who gave us the idea to start our own Thrift Store here in Easton. Jan & Skip Davis introduced me to their thrift operation in 2007. Bonita Springs started in the early 1970s with their thrift store when they bought a small piece of land in downtown Bonita Springs and put a camper trailer on it from which to sell second hand goods. Today they have a robust operation that hit a new record in sales of just over \$100,000 for the month of January. Yes, the MONTH of January. In November they went just over \$41,000. Their big months, of course, are January, February and March. The club has over 150 members now and they own several acres of land and an old church building on the property. They run weekly pancake breakfasts and are proud of their standing eve clinic.

They have three big furniture trucks with power rear gates. The trucks are driven by Lion members and they hire a couple stout young men to do the heavy lifting. They get to clean out complete houses of furniture on a regular basis. The retail space is over 30,000 square feet - most of it under cover.
